- Western region and North America to Hawaii formed a group by Danita to consider regular meetings
- Allan was interested in having regional meetings in Australia, New Zealand and Guam. Met with Yolanda Le, but she dropped from membership
- These are only groups continuing. Shall we boost up other groups to continue meetings? Is this still relevant? Did they meet due to COVID or people want to maintain through other discussions?
- Meeting regionally is a good chance to exchange experiences. Combining several countries across region to meet could be good
- But should staff put energy in organizing those events or country reps should run upon the need some informal meetings? Maybe better to keep as an open invitation, rather than pushing people to run across all regions.
- People in Vietnam and Malaysia are very active and interested to meet internationally
- Maybe we can do some research to understand if there is a unique need for those regional meetings (ex. those in North America and Western). What if allocating and aligning those meetings around topics of interest rather than general regional. That may help avoiding lack of interest also.


Summer Survey
