

Which Articles Should be Submitted to the APCD Journal?

Research articles are articles in which the authors report on the research they have conducted. Research articles may be an empirical article describing a research study, a short communication reporting results of a small study, or a review article summarizing results on a topic of current interest.

Why might you publish a paper in the Asia Pacific Career Development Journal (APCDJ)?

Asia Pacific Career Development Journal (APCDJ) is an international biannual publication focused on all career development and intervention related topics. The journal is open to manuscripts focused on, but not limited to topics such as: career counseling, individual and organizational career development, work and leisure, career education, career coaching, and career management. Methodologies can include literature reviews that make research accessible to practitioners, case studies, history and public policy analyses, qualitative research, and quantitative research of specific relevance to the practice of career development and counseling. Publishing a research article contributes to career advancement, professional recognition and development, increases chances for collaboration, contribution to the field of research and so on. All the manuscripts and questions are to be submitted electronically via Journal@AsiaPacificCDA.org.

Preparation of Manuscripts for the APCD Journal

Manuscripts should be typewritten, double-spaced with continuous line numbering, and margins of at least one inch on all sides. Page numbering should be consecutive throughout the manuscript. Submission to the journal indicates that the report represents unpublished work and that neither itself, nor parts of it, have been published or are under consideration for publication elsewhere. The manuscript should be a full-length research article and should not be more than 25 pages. Please refer to this link for further information:

All papers should be prepared according to the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (7th ed.; American Psychological Association [APA], 2020). Please see the APA Publication Manual for specific guidelines regarding the format of the manuscript, abstract, citations and references, tables and figures, and other matters of editorial style.

Please take note that the research article is different from the Conference Proceedings. Research article submissions normally take about 10 weeks between acknowledgment of the manuscript's receipt and notification of its disposition.

Abstract: Should be on page 2 and limited to 150 words.

Keywords: Should follow the abstract in page 2 and Keywords are limited to 5 words.

References: References, citations, and general style of papers should be prepared in accordance with the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (APA, 7th ed.) style.

When the paper is accepted for publication, the authors agree to automatic transfer of the copyright to the publisher.
