
Discussion: Possible Staff Addition

- We have a potential new applicant for the position of Executive Director who will be interviewed by 3 Officers and Marilyn on Sep 25/26.
- If hired, we will offer a position of Administrative Executive for the first year and see how things work out before announcing a change in management.
- We discussed useful questions to ask during the interview and people whose opinions we should seek before the interview.

Discussion: Future Goals Met in FY22

- We all received the Results Summary before the meeting and the verbal summary of that report is attached.
- Reviewing our goals for FY22, we saw the first goal was 75% adoption of Tradewing by Dec 2022. We currently have 272 active members in Tradewing out of 500 total (54%), so we are not there yet.
- Another goal was to identify member retention measures, starting in July. While the analysis of membership falls within the Membership Committee, Officers also suggested asking the Research Committee for help in establishing measurement tools and procedures to help us understand retention.
- It is clear that a review of the Future Goals needs to be completed in relation to what has happened this fiscal year and new plans and timelines are needed for the coming year. This responsibility falls on the Board and we ask that all Board members perform their own review before the October Board meeting and be prepared to discuss Future Goals at that meeting.
