Treasurer's Report (Nila - see attached)

- Conference Income/Expenses expected to change as we process final reports
- After 58% of our fiscal year, Income is at 96% of budget and expenses at 54%. This is positive.
- At this point, there are many outstanding questions about conference income and expenses (many were received after the April 30 cut-off).
- Hopefully we will still have positive net income after the conference accounting is complete.

• Labor Market Challenges – Unemployment Rates:

Canada: 6%Australia: 3.9%Korea: 3.0%Japan: 2.5%Malaysia 3.2%

Kazakhstan: skills gaps, urban-rural inequalities, and high youth unemployment

Economic Overview and Diversification Efforts

- Sri Lanka: economy contracted in 2023 but rebounded now
- Azerbaijan: nearing a peace agreement in the Nagorno-Karabakh
- Kazakhstan: efforts to diversify into agriculture, manufacturing, and technology
- Macau using educational tours to aid diversification

Education & Training

- o Korea: School-age population declines, international students increase
- o Sri Lanka: Technical and Vocational Education introduced career guidance
- Macau: initiates graduating student career plan survey
- o Taiwan: training workshops for Career Development Instructors and new programs for reentry women

Government Policies and Interventions

- o Malaysia: addressing work deficits and social protection
- Japan: Surveys show post-COVID recovery

Member Engagement Research: Future Action Steps (Serene)

- None of the expected topics have impact on member engagement
- All respondents expect to be more involved in the future
- Mongolia is asking about a model career center
- People who are highly engaged in attending conferences have the highest engagement in-person conference brings people together
- Hope to engage with China in the coming year
- Some rely on the recordings

Scholarships for Conflict Zone Scholars: Future Action Steps (Sini)

- Run a set of focus groups with scholars on their experience with the conference and better understand their needs
- Tailor future offerings better in the future
- Potential webinar on this topic

Discussion: How can we expand our cooperation with other international organizations in our field?

- IAEVG has a Call for Proposals, deadline May 31 (Finland, November)
- Conflict-zone scholars presentation (on behalf of APCDA)
- We also cooperate with NCDA, CERIC (Canada), and country organizations in our region (JCDA, CDAA (Susan Harvey), CDANZ, etc.)
- Mobilizing other partners in other parts of the world. The differences between regions are less than the similarities.
- Cataloguing needs in various parts of the world might be useful.
- Engage with other events (where APCDA can have a presence)
- Invite participants from around our region to discuss needs and actions at our conferences
- Use annual meeting discussion to start this process
- Cooperate with the Arab CDA
